

**Notification of the Ministry of Public Health  
Concerning the Yellow Fever Vaccination  
B.E. 2560 (2017)**

For the benefit of surveillance, prevention and control of yellow fever, a dangerous communicable disease, to prevent it from entering the Kingdom of Thailand, it is required that travelers from or through countries which have been declared Yellow Fever Affected Areas must have received a yellow fever vaccination prior to their entry.

By the virtue of provisions of Section 5 paragraph 1 and Section 6 (3) of the Communicable Diseases Act B.E. 2558 (2015), the Minister of Public Health, with the advice from the National Communicable Disease Committee, hereby issues a notification as follows;

Clause 1. According to this Notification, “Yellow Fever Affected Areas” means areas or ports outside the Kingdom of Thailand which have been declared Yellow Fever Affected Areas by the Minister of Public Health.

Clause 2. Certificate of yellow fever vaccination shall be effective 10 days after the date of vaccination onwards. In case of a booster vaccination, it shall be effective since the date of vaccination. The certificate of vaccination against yellow fever is valid for the life of the person vaccinated.

Clause 3. Travelers from or through countries which have been declared Yellow Fever Affected Areas must provide a certificate of yellow fever vaccination to the Communicable Disease Control Officer at the port of entry.

Clause 4. In the case of a traveler from or through countries which have been declared Yellow Fever Affected Areas does not provide a certificate of yellow fever vaccination or provide an invalid one, the Communicable Disease Control Officer at the port of entry shall take either of the following actions;

(1) Issue an order to prohibit the owner or custodian of the vehicle from entering the Kingdom of Thailand in accordance with Section 39 (5) of the Communicable Diseases Act B.E. 2558 (2017).

(2) Issue an order in writing to the owner or custodian of the vehicle to take either of the actions in accordance with Section 40 of the Communicable Diseases Act B.E. 2558 (2017).

5. In the case of a traveler from or through countries which have been declared Yellow Fever Affected Areas provides a certificate of yellow fever vaccination but the certification is not yet effective as specified in Clause 2, the Communicable Disease Control Officer at the port of entry shall issue an order in writing for isolation, quarantine, or control for observation of such person, as seen appropriate, until the yellow fever vaccination certificate enters into effect.

The period of isolation, quarantine, or control for observation must not exceed 10 days from the date of yellow fever vaccination.

6. This Ministerial Notification shall enter into force from the day following the date of its publication in the Government Gazette.<sup>1</sup>

Clause 1. The yellow fever affected areas or ports outside the Kingdom of Thailand shall be identified as follows;
